

SEXUAL ASSUALT RESOURCES

No one should ever have to experience sexual assault, but it does happen. Sometimes people are not sure how to “name” a sexual encounter that they felt uncomfortable about. Sexual violence occurs whenever someone is pressured or forced into unwanted sexual activity without their consent. It can happen to anyone, regardless of their gender identity or sexual orientation.

It can be incredibly difficult to deal with everyday life and the physical and/or emotional trauma for days, weeks, or even years after having experienced sexual violence. The **AUCC-Student Health and Wellness Center** offers support to survivors of sexual violence, including type any unwanted sexual encounter, by providing medical and behavioral (mental) health services.
